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2018 FIRE TRAINING

Live Fire Class B Foam Operation

This course provides practical training for mitigating spills and fires involving ignitable liquids. Topics covered include: overview of ignitable liquids including gasoline, crude oil and fuel grade ethanol; use of class B foam, with emphasis on alcohol resistant foam concentrates; foam nozzles and proportioning equipment; and determining foam needs for various scenarios. There are also hands on practical activities involving vapor suppression with finished foam, confining spills, and live fire extinguishment. During live fire evolutions, foam handlines will be set up and employed for leaking and burning tank truck. **A signed Training Authorization Letter is required at Lesson 1 for all students. Full structural turnout gear and SCBA with spare cylinder are required for lessons 2 & 3.**

Live Fire Class B Foam Operations

This course includes several evolutions that require the use of Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) and firefighter turnout gear. Students should be in good health and be prepared to work under live-fire conditions with SCBA for as long as 30 minutes at a time during multiple stations. All participants are required to submit a Training Authorization letter in accordance with Office of Fire Prevention and Control regulations. Forms can be downloaded at www.dhSES.ny.gov/ofpc/documents/authorization.pdf.

Participants are required to bring:

SCBA with an air cylinder

One spare air cylinder

OSHA approved firefighter protective clothing (consisting of helmet with eye protection, coat, pants, boots, gloves and hood)

During evolutions involving firefighter turnout gear, students will get wet.
