

The regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors was held in their chambers in the Court House, Chairman Miller presiding.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Supervisor Spickerman, followed by Chairman Miller giving the invocation.

Upon roll call, all Supervisors were present except for Supervisor Verkey.

County Administrator Richard House and County Attorney Daniel Connors were also present for this morning's session.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

Mr. Lasher moved, seconded by Mrs. Jacobs, to waive the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting and approve them as distributed. Upon roll call, carried.

**COMMUNICATIONS:**

A copy of the Sheriff's Office Cash Receipts Report dated July 16, 2021 totaling \$10,831.78 was received and filed.

A copy of the County Auditor's accounts payable report for monthly utilities, miscellaneous payments including the July 2021 warrants for accounts payable, totaling \$5,448,536.49 was received and filed.

**PROCLAMATION**

Public Defender Andy Correia and Public Safety Chairman Phil Eygnor recognized Assistant Public Defender Arline Hanna with a Proclamation of Accomplishment for receiving the 2021 Kevin M. Andersen Memorial Award.

**IN MEMORIAM**

Public Defender Andy Correia also took this opportunity to read a resolution prepared for William D. Hendricks, Assistant Public Defender who dedicated 35 years to the Wayne County Public Defender's Office. William's wife Nancy and daughter Maddie were both in attendance to receive William's memorial tribute.

Chairman Miller took a moment to acknowledge the recently elevated high risk rating level of COVID-19 cases within Wayne County. He noted that the County will continue to monitor and adjust the rating as it's released. County staff will continue to follow CDC recommendations at this time. **RESOLUTION 369-21: AUTHORIZATION TO PAY STIPEND TO HEAD LIFE GUARDS SERVING AS DIRECTOR/ASSISTANT DIRECTOR FOR SODUS POINT BEACH**

Mr. Verno presented the following:

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Department for Aging and Youth receives funding to coordinate the supervised swimming program at Sodus Point Beach Park in the summer, and

WHEREAS, the Department hires one Director and one Assistant Director and a team of Head Guards, each with their own role and function to play on their assigned shifts; and

WHEREAS, there are occasions where the Director and Assistant Director are both off and a Head Guard must assume their role; and

WHEREAS, the Department has budgeted to pay these Head Guards an additional \$0.65/hour for assuming increased responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Aging and Youth is seeking approval to pay the Head Guards who agree to accept the additional responsibilities of Director or Assistant Director the budgeted stipend, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the Department of Aging and Youth is authorized to apply the Head Guard stipend retroactively to the beginning of the 2021 season to Head Guards who have agreed to accept additional responsibilities on shifts where the Director and Assistant Director are not scheduled.

**RESOLUTION 370-21: AUTHORIZATION TO CREATE AND FILL A SERVICE ASSISTANT POSITION FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF AGING AND YOUTH**

Mr. Verno presented the following:

WHEREAS, the Department of Aging and Youth receives state and federal funding to provide nutrition services to older adults, and

WHEREAS, due to increased demand for home delivered meals and assessment requirements resuming, an additional caseworker is needed to provide quality services and meet federal guidelines for the home delivered meals program, and

WHEREAS, the Department would like to create an additional service assistant position, using stimulus funding to conduct assessments for the home delivered meals program in order to avoid waitlists of seniors needing meals; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED that a service assistant position be created within the Department of Aging and Youth for the purpose of completing assessments and other required duties within the Department's nutrition programs and the Director of Aging and Youth is authorized to fill said position; and be it further

RESOLVED, in the event further funding is not available, the Aging and Youth Department will present a resolution to abolish said position' and be it further

RESOLVED that the Wayne County Treasurer is authorized to amend the 2021 County Budget as follows:

**RESOLUTION 371-21: AUTHORIZATION TO CREATE AND FILL A FULL TIME HOME HEALTH AIDE POSITION FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF AGING AND YOUTH**

Mr. Verno presented the following:

WHEREAS, the Department of Aging and Youth receives state and federal funding to provide in-home services to eligible older adults, and

WHEREAS, due to increased demand and decreasing community resources, an additional FT Home Health Aide is needed to provide timely services to older adults, avoiding waitlists for service as much as possible, and

WHEREAS, the Department would like to create an additional FT Home Health Aide position, using existing state and federal funding, therefore be it

RESOLVED that a FT Home Health Aide position be created within the Department of Aging and Youth for the purpose of providing services to older adults and their caregivers and the Director of Aging and Youth is authorized to fill said position; and be it further

RESOLVED, in the event further funding is not available, the Aging and Youth Department will present a resolution to abolish said position.

**RESOLUTION 372-21: AUTHORIZATION FOR DEPARTMENT OF AGING AND YOUTH TO CONTRACT WITH WAYNE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICTS FOR THE FAMILY AND COMMUNITIES TOGETHER PROGRAM**

Mr. Verno presented the following:

WHEREAS, the Families and Communities Together (FACT) Program is designed to assist families that have children in grades K through 8 who are exhibiting emotional and/or behavioral issues by providing intensive case management services and thereby preventing an out-of-home placement; and

WHEREAS, all eleven Wayne County school districts have requested to enter into a contractual agreement with the Department of Aging and Youth for the provision of FACT services, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Aging and Youth agrees to provide FACT services to a specified number children per school district at a sum of \$1000.00 per family; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract on behalf of the Department of Aging and Youth for the provision of FACT services with the schools listed below in the amount specified, for the contract year from September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022, subject to the County Attorney's approval as to form and content.

**RESOLUTION 373-21: AUTHORIZATION TO EXTEND THE CONTRACT WITH MOM'S MEALS THROUGH DECEMBER, 31, 2021 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF AGING AND YOUTH**

Mr. Verno presented the following:

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Department for Aging and Youth was authorized by the Board to enter into a contract with Mom's Meals to provide meals to older adults through the home delivered meals program, and

WHEREAS, this contract serves as a back up to the existing Home Delivered Meals Provider using emergency stimulus funds; and

WHEREAS, initially the funding was to be expended by September 30, 2021 and so the contract end date is September 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the date to have funds expended has been extended and additional stimulus funding for nutritional services has been received that can be used through September 2024; and

WHEREAS, no additional funds will be added to the contract amount; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Aging and Youth desires to extend the contract with Mom's Meals through December 31, 2021, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is authorized and directed to execute a contract amendment with Mom's Meals extending the end date of the contract to December 31, 2021, subject to the county attorney's review and approval.

WHEREAS, the NYS Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) received an allocation of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), for the purpose of supporting local counties efforts to respond to the pandemic, COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Department of Social Services was authorized to accept \$383,957 from NYS OTDA per Resolution No. 180-21 dated April 20, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Department of Social Services, through the County RFP process received 2 bids, one for the full grant amount and one for a partial grant amount; and

WHEREAS, the locally developed strategy is for the Wayne County Department of Social Services to contract with Finger Lakes Area Counseling and Recovery Agency, Inc. (FLACRA) for the purpose of providing outreach, rapid rehousing and prevention services to eligible individuals and families; and

WHEREAS, Wayne County's allocation is to be expended according to the directives of NYS OTDA 20-LCM-06; and

WHEREAS, Wayne County Department of Social Services seeks to subcontract with FLACRA for Phase 2 of the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) allocation of \$383,957; and

WHEREAS, FLACRA seeks to subcontract a portion of the ESG allocation to Victim Resource Center and Legal Assistance of Western NY (LAWNY); and

WHEREAS, a contract is required to enter into the arrangement between Wayne County Department of Social Services and FLACRA; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to execute a subcontract on behalf of the County of Wayne, subject to the County Attorney's approval as to form and content, with FLACRA for the provision of services required by policy directive 20-LCM-06; and be it further

**RESOLUTION 375-21: AUTHORIZATION TO SIGN AGREEMENT WITH CHILD CARING INSTITUTION – CHILDREN’S HOME OF WYOMING CONFERENCE**

Mr. Verno presented the following:

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Department of Social Services (DSS) needs to place children in child caring institutions, at times, to promote their health and safety; and

WHEREAS, payment for these services is not determined by the county but is dictated by New York State; and

WHEREAS, it has been the practice of DSS to have in place contracts with various child caring institutions to facilitate a child’s placement on a timely basis; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with Children’s Home of Wyoming Conference for the timeframe 10/1/21-9/30/24 for the purchase of foster care for children, subject to the County Attorney’s approval as to form and content for an amount not to exceed \$275,000 or \$91,666 per year.

Mr. Verno presented the following:

WHEREAS, the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (NYS OCFS), through its Bureau of Adult Protective Services has, through the use of CARES Act funding made allocations to local Social Services Districts for the purpose of supporting vulnerable adults with meeting basic needs in furtherance of their ability to live independently in the community; and

WHEREAS, the allocation to Wayne County Department of Social Services was set at \$6,537.00 to be expended on direct services to vulnerable adults beginning April 1, 2021 and continuing through May 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Department of Social Services intends to use this allocation to enhance, improve and expand the agency’s Adult Protective Services ability to investigate allegations of abuse, neglect or exploitation and to further assure the safety and well-being of vulnerable adults by enhancing outreach, providing resources to meet basic needs, supporting the least restrictive option for emergency or alternative housing, coordinating with care providers as appropriate, and acquiring personal protection and supplies intended to minimize the spread of infection among vulnerable adults; and

WHEREAS, this allocation is 100% reimbursable and incurs no locally born county costs; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Department of Social Services is authorized to accept the allocation of \$6,537.00 from the Office of Children and Family Services bureau of Adult Protective Services for the purpose of enhancing services to vulnerable adults; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Treasurer is authorized to make the following amendment to the 2021 County Budget:

**RESOLUTION 378-21: AUTHORIZATION TO CONTRACT WITH DAIKIN APPLIED FOR HVAC EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE AT THE WAYNE COUNTY NURSING HOME**

Mrs. Jacobs presented the following:

WHEREAS, the Nursing Home requires routine inspections and preventative maintenance for its chiller, along with on-demand repairs and services when necessary; and

WHEREAS, only Daikin Applied Certified Technicians are factory trained and supported by Daikin to perform work on their equipment, making them a sole source provider of the required services to the existing Daikin/McQuay HVAC equipment at the Nursing Home; and

WHEREAS, the term of the contract is for a three (3) year period commencing August 1, 2021 and ending August 1, 2024 at a cost of \$5,798.00 for year 1; \$5,972.00 for year 2; and \$6,152.00 for year 3, plus labor at the specified hourly rates and parts for work above and beyond the scope of the maintenance agreement; and

WHEREAS, as part of the agreement, Daikin will include a 10% discount off street rates and Daikin materials; and

WHEREAS, the specified rates for additional work, not included in the routine maintenance, are as follows: 2021 Hourly Rate: \$148.50; 2021 Overtime Rate: \$222.75; 2021 Double Time Rate: \$297.00 (Sundays and Holidays); Mileage Rate: \$0.20/mile Truck Charge: \$50 per day; and

WHEREAS, future rates will be adjusted based on inflation percentages and/or union wage increases; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors be authorized to sign the agreement with Daikin Applied for HVAC equipment, maintenance and service on behalf of the Wayne County Nursing Home effective August 1, 2021 to August 1, 2024, subject to the County Attorney's approval as to form and content.

WHEREAS, the contract with Health Direct Pharmacy (Kinney Drugs) for the provision of pharmacy services expires on September 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, New York State Office of General Services is awarding Health Direct Pharmacy (Kinney Drugs) a three (3) months extension through December 31, 2021; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Wayne County Board of Supervisor be authorized and directed to extend the contract, on behalf of Wayne County Nursing Home, with Health Direct Pharmacy (Kinney Drugs) for pharmacy services for an additional a three (3) months through December 31, 2021, subject to the County Attorney's approval as to form and content.

**RESOLUTION 380-21: AUTHORIZATION TO SIGN A MULTI-YEAR CONTRACT WITH THE NYSDOH FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF WAYNE COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH'S EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAM**

Mrs. Jacobs presented the following:

WHEREAS, the mission of the statewide Early Intervention Program (EIP) is to identify and evaluate as early as possible those infants and toddlers whose healthy development is compromised and provide appropriate intervention to improve child and family development; and

WHEREAS, local governments are responsible for administering the EIP, subject to regulations of the Commissioner of Health, Subpart 69-4 of subchapter H of Chapter II of Title 10 (Health) of the Official Compilation of Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, administrative funds are provided to municipalities to offset costs incurred in the implementation of the EIP; and

WHEREAS, Wayne County Public Health (WCPH) has been notified by the NYSDOH of the release of the next multi-year contract for the period of October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2026; and

WHEREAS, WCPH will receive a total amount of \$330,075 with annual funding of \$66,015; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to sign a multi-year contract, along with any future amendments, with the New York State Department of Health for the administration of the EIP by WCPH, for the period of October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2026, for an annual amount of \$66,015 with a total multi-year amount of \$330,075, subject to the County Attorney's approval as to form and content.

**RESOLUTION 381-21: AUTHORIZATION TO AMEND RESOLUTION NO. 214-16 TO EXTEND CONTRACT WITH THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR THE LEAD POISONING PREVENTION PROGRAM**

Mrs. Jacobs presented the following:

WHEREAS, Wayne County Public Health (WCPH) currently holds a contract with the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) to perform lead poisoning prevention education and surveillance activities; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 214-16 established a five (5) year contract for the period of October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2020 for an annual amount of \$37,489; and

WHEREAS, WCPH has recently received notification from the NYSDOH that this contract will be extended to September 30, 2021 for the same annual amount of \$37,489; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to amend Resolution No. 214-16 and sign the NYSDOH Lead Poisoning Prevention Program contract amendment, via Grants Gateway, to extend the contract to September 30, 2021 for the same annual amount of \$37,489, subject to the approval of the County Attorney as to form and content.

**RESOLUTION 382-21: AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT THE GOVERNOR'S TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMITTEE CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY PROGRAM AWARD FOR WAYNE COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH**

Mrs. Jacobs presented the following:

WHEREAS, Wayne County Public Health (WCPH) currently receives funding from the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee to participate in the statewide Child Passenger Safety Program; and

WHEREAS, the state's Child Passenger Safety program requires all awardees to provide the following child car seat programing: be a permanent fitting station, to purchase car seats, hold car seat check events, and provide seat education and distribution to low income individuals who do not own or has an expired child car seat; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee has selected WCPH to participate in the statewide Child Passenger Safety program, with an award amount of \$4,300 for the period of October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022; and

WHEREAS, with awards lower than \$10,000, awardees will only receive an award letter and will not receive a contract to execute; and

WHEREAS, WCPH has already submitted the award of \$4,300 in the proposed 2022 WCPH budget, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Director of Public Health is hereby authorized to accept the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee Child Passenger Safety program award of \$4,300 for the period of October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022.

WHEREAS, the New York State Capital Projects Budget authorizes funds for use by county boards of elections for capital and implementation costs. WHEREAS, Wayne County Advanced Life Support (ALS) is staffed with Paramedics (Advanced Life Support Technicians) employed on a full time basis, as well as part time and/or substitute basis, and

WHEREAS, the primary job functions of an Advanced Life Support Technician are equivalent, with all employees possessing the same credentials, and all must maintain Paramedic certification and regional credentials for continuing employment on an ongoing basis, and

WHEREAS, recruitment of highly valued, experienced Paramedics is especially difficult, as agencies compete to hire from the same limited number of candidates, and

WHEREAS, currently, all newly hired full and part time ALS Technicians must start at the "hire" rate, as specified in the current CSEA Agreement, regardless of the amount of experience the Paramedic has, and

WHEREAS, the pay rate for all part time (and substitute) Wayne County ALS Technicians currently remains at the hire rate for the duration of employment with Wayne County ALS, resulting in a situation where the rate of pay for experienced individuals is often far less than similarly qualified individuals receive at other agencies, and

WHEREAS, Wayne County ALS management personnel have met with CSEA officers to discuss this situation, and have agreed that permitting experienced Paramedics to be hired at a higher step than the listed hire rate would be of benefit to recruitment, and

WHEREAS, permitting part time/substitute ALS Technicians to move up to higher steps within the pay grade at each anniversary date, in a manner equivalent to full time employees, would be of significant benefit for retention of non-full time ALS Technicians, who are not represented by CSEA, and would not otherwise be included among those affected by a Memorandum of Agreement between the County and CSEA; and

WHEREAS, the County of Wayne ("County") and the Wayne County Employees' Unit of the Civil Service Employees' Association, Inc., Local 859 ("Association") have met and agreed to implement certain provisions aimed at improving the County's ability to recruit and retain staff within the Advanced Life Support Unit by permitting advanced placement within the specified pay grade for ALS Technician based on experience; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to execute a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Association to include the following provisions, to be effective beginning on September 3, 2021;

1. New full time ALS Technicians with less than twenty-four (24) months of full-time or part-time equivalent paid experience in providing Paramedic ALS prehospital care prior to the date of appointment, will continue to start at the hire rate of the bargaining unit, as specified in the CSEA Agreement.

2. New full time ALS Technicians who have not less than the number of months indicated below of full-time or part-time equivalent paid experience in providing Paramedic ALS prehospital care prior to the date of appointment, shall start at:

Midpoint 1 rate with not less than twenty-four (24) months experience

Midpoint 2 rate with not less than thirty-six (36) months experience

3. Full time ALS Technicians employed prior to this agreement will be placed within the appropriate step based on original full time appointment date and experience rated on T & E examination at time of appointment, and any time as a part time or substitute ALS Technician for Wayne County ALS, if applicable, provided that such time was not included in the T&E exam calculations mentioned above.

4. Any step increases shall occur thereafter as scheduled on each anniversary date of appointment

And be it further

RESOLVED, that substitute and part time ALS Technicians who are not covered by the CSEA Agreement shall follow similar guidelines, also effective beginning with pay period September 3, 2021;

1. New part time or substitute ALS Technicians with less than twenty-four (24) months of full-time or part-time equivalent paid experience in providing Paramedic ALS prehospital care prior to the date of appointment, will continue to start at the hire rate of the bargaining unit, as specified in the CSEA Agreement.

2. New part time or substitute ALS Technicians employed who have not less than the number of months indicated below of full-time or part-time equivalent paid experience in providing Paramedic ALS prehospital care prior to the date of appointment, shall start at:

Midpoint 1 rate with not less than twenty-four (24) months experience

Midpoint 2 rate with not less than thirty-six (36) months experience

3. Part time and substitute ALS Technicians employed prior to September 3, 2021 will be placed within the appropriate step based on original appointment date and experience rated on T & E examination at time of appointment, and time employed as an ALS Technician for Wayne County ALS in either a full time, part time or substitute capacity, as applicable

4. Part time and substitute ALS Technicians shall be eligible for step increases step as specified for full time ALS Technicians in the CSEA Agreement on each anniversary date of appointment thereafter. Substitute and part time ALS Technicians shall not be eligible for longevity increases.

5. Part time and substitute ALS Technicians who may go full time at a later date will follow the full time seniority date for benefits and additional step increases.

WHEREAS, this "crew completion" service is provided for both ALS and BLS (Basic Life Support) types of calls, and

WHEREAS, although it is most common for the Paramedics of Wayne County ALS to provide patient care during transportation of the patient to the hospital, there are also occasions where the Paramedics of Wayne County ALS drive the agency ambulances, and transport agency personnel provide patient care, instead of the County Paramedics, and

WHEREAS, in cases where the County Paramedics drive for other Paramedics in crew completion, rather than providing ALS care during transport to the hospital, there is no mechanism for any cost recovery, although there would be some cost recovery if the County Paramedics were providing direct patient care during transport, as is most common for ALS type incidents; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that in cases where it is requested that the County Paramedics of Wayne County ALS drive an ambulance for a Paramedic (or Critical Care Tech) of a transporting agency to complete a full crew, for incidents coded for ALS response, the transporting EMS agency shall be charged \$175 by the County, or another amount as may later be specified by the Public Safety Committee of the Board of Supervisors, per incident, for supplying a driver to the transporting EMS agency, and be it further

WHEREAS, the third year Budget and Work Plan for this contract has been reviewed by appropriate members of Wayne County's administrative team and subsequently approved by the Office of Indigent Legal Services; and

WHEREAS, this contract funding shall continue to be used for three written plans consisting of counsel at arraignment, quality improvement, and caseload relief pursuant to the 2017 amendment to County Law Section 772-e and enactment of Executive Law Section 832(4), "Statewide Expansion of Hurrell-Harring Reform"; and

WHEREAS, Wayne County has received notification that funding for the third year of the overall contract has been appropriated in the 2021 State budget to continue to provide financial support for mandated improvements to both the Public Defender's Office and the Assigned Counsel Program; and

WHEREAS, the proposed third year plan Amendment to Contract Number CSTWIDEHH50 includes the third year Budget and Work Plan for the Public Defender's Office for the amount of \$759,346.97, and the Assigned Counsel Program for the amount of \$192,384.72, for a total of \$986,231.69 with a term of April 1, 2020 through March 31, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the third year Budget and Work Plan for Wayne County, term of April 1, 2020 through March 31, 2021, is set out in full description and detail in Amendment to Contract Number CSTWIDEHH50, Budget Attachments B-1 and C which includes expenditures for both the Public Defender and the Assigned Counsel Program; and

WHEREAS, the third year of the five-year Statewide Expansion of Hurrell-Harring Reform-Wayne, Contract Number CTWIDEHH50, will continue to be referred to as ILSHH and;

WHEREAS, the ILSHH third year Public Defender funding shall allow us to work toward the various State mandates the Public Defender must comply with by 2023, including:

- Funding an already-approved felony level full time Assistant Public Defender position,

WHEREAS, the STOP-DWI Program functions as a financially self-sustaining alcohol and highway safety program which does not use tax payer dollars, therefore, the \$10,000 reimbursement from the Council by law must be placed in the STOP-DWI Program rollover reserve fund; therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Treasurer is recommending the following amendments to section X. Permitted Investments of the 2021 County investment policy:

**X. PERMITTED INVESTMENTS:**

1. As provided by General Municipal Law Section 11, the Wayne County Board of Supervisors authorizes the County Treasurer to invest moneys not required for immediate expenditure for terms not to exceed its projected cash flow needs in the following types of investments:
2. Special time deposit accounts in, or certificates of deposit issued by, a bank or trust company located and authorized to do business in New York State;
3. Through a Deposit Placement Program, certificates of deposit in one or more "banking institutions", as defined in Banking Law Section 9-r;
4. Obligations of the United States of America;
5. Obligations guaranteed by agencies of the United States of America, where the payment of principal and interest are guaranteed by the United States of America;
6. Obligations of the State; With the approval of the State Comptroller, obligations issued pursuant to Local Finance Law Section 24.00 or 25.00 (i.e., Tax Anticipation Notes and Revenue Anticipation Notes) by any municipality, school district or district corporation in the State other than the County of Wayne;
7. General obligation bonds and notes of any state other than this state, provided that such bonds and notes receive the highest rating of at least one independent rating agency designated by the state comptroller.
8. Obligations of any corporation organized under the laws of any state in the United States maturing within two hundred seventy days, provided that such obligations receive the highest rating of two independent rating services designated by the state comptroller and that the issuer of such obligations has maintained such ratings on similar obligations during the preceding six months, provided, however, that the issuer of such obligations need not have received such rating during the prior six month period if such issuer has received the highest rating of two independent rating services designated by the state comptroller and is the successor or wholly-owned subsidiary of an issuer that has maintained such ratings on similar obligations during the preceding six month period or if the issuer is the product of a merger of two or more issuers, one of which has maintained such ratings on similar obligations during the preceding six month period, provided, however, that no more than two hundred fifty million dollars may be invested in such obligations of any one corporation.
9. Bankers' acceptances maturing within two hundred seventy days which are eligible for purchase in the open market by federal reserve banks and which have been accepted by a bank or trust company which is organized under the laws of the United States or of any state thereof and which is a member of the federal reserve system and whose short-term obligations meet the criteria outlined in clause (7). Provided, however, that no more than two hundred fifty million dollars may be invested in such bankers' acceptances of any one bank or trust company; or
10. Obligations of, or instruments issued by or fully guaranteed as to principal and interest by, any agency or instrumentality of the United States acting pursuant to a grant of authority from the Congress of the United States, including but not limited to, any federal home loan bank or banks, the Tennessee valley authority, the federal national mortgage association, the federal home loan mortgage corporation and the United States postal service, provided, however, that no more than two hundred fifty million dollars may be invested in such obligations of any one agency.
11. No-load money market mutual funds registered under the Securities Act of 1933, as amended, and operated in accordance with Rule 2a-7 of the Investment Company Act of 1940, as amended, provided that such funds are limited to investments in obligations issued or guaranteed by the United States of America or in obligations of agencies or instrumentalities of the United States of America where the payment of principal and interest are guaranteed by the

United States of America (including contracts for the sale and repurchase of any such obligations) and are rated in the highest rating category by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization, provided, however, that no more than two hundred fifty million dollars may be invested in such funds.

12. Obligations of the County of Wayne, but only with any moneys in a reserve fund established pursuant to General Municipal Law 6-c, 6-d, 6-e, 6-g, 6-h, 6-j, 6-k, 6-l, 6-m, or 6-n.

All investment obligations shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within such times as the proceeds will be needed to meet expenditures for the purposes for which the moneys were provided and, in the case of obligations purchased with the proceeds of bonds or notes, shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within two years of the date of purchase. Time deposit accounts and certificates of deposit shall be payable within such time as the proceeds will be needed to meet expenditures for which the moneys were obtained, and shall be secured as provided in Section VIII and IX herein.

Except as may otherwise be provided in a contract with bondholders or noteholders, any money of the County authorized to be invested may be commingled for investment purposes, provided that any investment commingled moneys shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the County within such time as the proceeds shall be needed to meet expenditures for which such moneys were obtained, or as otherwise specifically provided in General Municipal Law Section 11. The separate identity of the sources of these funds shall be maintained at all times and income received shall be credited on a pro rata basis to the fund or account from which the moneys were invested.

Any obligation that provides for the adjustment of its interest rate on set dates is deemed to be payable or redeemable on the date on which the principal amount can be recovered through demand by the holder.

Now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, the Board of Supervisors approves the amendment of section X. Permitted Investments of the Investment Policy for the County of Wayne 2021 effective August 17, 2021.

- Expenditure planning for the duration of grant period including assessing short-term needs and future projects to meet the required expenditure deadline of December 31, 2024
- Assisting the County with a grant management program – including grant programs for businesses/individuals and subsequent periodic monitoring
- Assistance with single audit compliance related to these funds
- Guidance and instruction related to the monitoring and reporting of the ARPA funds
- Assisting with Compliance with ARPA regulations including assistance with determining allowable expenditures
- Meetings with County representatives and/or Board to discuss actions
- Other services as desired by the County as the final regulations have not yet been issued, and additional assistance may be requested

WHEREAS, this expenditure is an allowable expense, 100% covered by ARPA funding; and

WHEREAS, the County Treasurer solicited and received the following quotes:
