Much of the information in this cobblestone guide and map has been taken from a Hoffman Scholarship Essay written in 1955 by Verlyn Klahn. "Cobblestone Structures of Wayne County," the essay documents 152 cobblestone structures. Many have been destroyed and many have since been "discovered." The numbering system used in this guide corresponds to Mr. Klahn's system so that easy reference to his information is available to those wishing more details. Any information on cobblestone structures that has not been included will be appreciated by the Wayne County Historical Society and will be added to Mr. Klahn's essay at the museum.

When using this cobblestone guide, please remember that most of these buildings are private residences. Information on the Wayne County Parks System is available from the Wayne County Historian, 9 Pearl Street, Lyons, New York 14489, and will make picnicking while touring most enjoyable.

This structure was originally a schoolhouse.

Colored field stones, wooden lintels

Large Victorian home, Mansard roof

Interesting ruins of large colonial

Originally a schoolhouse

Lake stones laid on a slant

Originally a well house

Destroyed

Home built to replace log cabin

Former Blacksmith shop
6. County Road 218
Barn with wooden addition

1 1/2 story with double window dormers

Rows of different colored stones

Red lake stones of uniform size

Taller front windows to lighten home

Destroyed

Stones laid horizontally
3. Red Road
Large stones, herringbone in front

1. 4917 Route 88
Originally a smokehouse
2. Buerman Road
Lake and field stones

Red lake stones, wooden lintels

1851, church, beautiful stone bands

"J. Collier 1840" inscribed on stone

Addition is gray and black stones

1843, irregular field stones

Colonial revival, interesting doorway

Once was the Hall Center Schoolhouse
4. West Walworth
Church with stained glass windows
5. 3353 Daansen Road
1830's, each side has different colors

6. Walworth-Penfield Road
"M. Padley 1844" inscribed on datestone
7. 2203 Walworth-Penfield Road
1 1/2 story with 1 story wing
8. Walworth-Penfield Road
Was a factory of acetylene lighting
9. Walworth-Ontario road
Square large fieldstones
10. Gananda Parkway
Red brick quoins, unique windows
11. West Walworth
Abandoned shed
12. Canandaigua Road
Perhaps this was a milkhouse
13. Lewis Road
Lake and field stones

Surface is small lake stone veneer

Destroyed

1840-42, replaced log cabin
5. 3424 Ridge Road at Ridge Chapel Road
1839, once a Methodist Church
6. 2871 Ridge Road
1835, each side is different
7. 6403 Salmon Creek Road
"By C. B. Adams 1850," very stately
8. 3653 Ridge Road
All colored lake stones
9. Ridge Road (gas station)
Beautiful cast iron grills at roof
10. Ridge Road
All colored lake stones

Schoolhouse, now covered with siding
