Local Law No. 4 of the year 1995

A local law amending the longevity payment schedule for non-elected County officers and employees not subject to collective bargaining agreements, as established by Local Law No. 7-1984 and amended by Local Law No. 5-1988, Local Law No. 1-1986, Local Law No. 5-1993 and Local Law No. 3-1994.

Be it enacted by the Board of Supervisors of the

County

City of Wayne

Town

Village

as follows:

SECTION 1.

Section 1 of Local Law No. 7-1984 entitled "A Local Law Establishing Longevity Payment Schedule for Non-Elected County Officers and Employees Not Subject to Collective Bargaining Agreements", as amended by Local Law No. 5-1988, Local Law No. 1-1986, Local Law No. 5-1993 and Local Law No. 3-1994, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1.

(a) Except as provided in subdivision (b), effective from and after January 1, 1995, and continuing annually thereafter, all full-time, non-elected County officers and employees not subject to collective bargaining agreements shall receive, in addition to adopted salary schedules, longevity payments upon completion of 5, 7, 10, 13, 16, 20, and 25 years of full-time continuous service with the County in accordance with the following schedule:

This local law shall take effect on the date it is filed in the Office of the Secretary of State as provided in Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York and shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect from and after January 1, 1995.



ADOPT LOCAL LAW AMENDING THE LONGEVITY PAYMENT SCHEDULE FOR
NON-ELECTED COUNTY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES NOT SUBJECT TO
COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS

Mr. Prober presented the following:

WHEREAS, a proposed local law in relation to amending the longevity payment schedule for non-elected County officers and employees not subject to collective bargaining agreements, as established by Local Law No. 7-1984 and amended by Local Law No. 5-1988, Local Law No. 1-1986, Local Law No. 5-1993 and Local Law No. 3-1994 was presented to the Board of Supervisors on August 15, 1995; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the proposed local law was held by the Board of Supervisors on September 19, 1995, in accordance with the notice of hearing duly posted and published in the manner prescribed by law; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED, that said local law is hereby adopted to read as follows:

COUNTY OF WAYNE - STATE OF NEW YORK

A Local Law amending the longevity payment schedule for non-elected County officers and employees not subject to collective bargaining agreements, as established by Local Law No. 7-1984 and amended by Local Law No. 5-1988, Local Law No. 1-1986, Local Law No. 5-1993 and Local Law No. 3-1994.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WAYNE, as follows:

SECTION 1.

Section 1 of Local Law No. 7-1984 entitled "A Local Law Establishing Longevity Payment Schedule for Non-Elected County Officers and Employees Not Subject to Collective Bargaining Agreements", as amended by Local Law No. 5-1988, Local Law No. 1-1986, Local Law No. 5-1993 and Local Law No. 3-1994, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1.

(a) Except as provided in Subdivision (b), effective from and after January 1, 1995, and continuing annually thereafter, all full-time, non-elected County officers and employees not subject to collective bargaining agreements shall receive, in addition to adopted salary schedules, longevity payments upon completion of 5, 7, 10, 13, 16, 20, and 25 years of full-time continuous service with the County in accordance with the following schedule:

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby directed to number the local law in conformance with the filing requirements of the Secretary of State and to file the local law with the Secretary of State in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Home Rule Law of the State of New York.
